Supplies of non-mulesed wool from Australia up 44%

Data on exports from the five major wool producing and exporting countries for the 2017/18 season to September shows that total exports grew by 10% compared with the 2016/17 level. This is a recovery from the 3% decline that we saw in the full 2016/17 season. There has been an increase in exports from Australia (+7%), New Zealand (+12%), South Africa (+31%) and Uruguay (+40%). Of the five major exporters, only Argentina has recorded a decline, down by 10%. This improvement for New Zealand and Uruguay is a recovery from the large decline seen in exports from both of these countries in the past 12-18 months. The increase in exports from Australia and South Africa since the second half of 2016 can be seen clearly, and this continues. These two countries are the major exporters of Merino wool, which saw strong demand throughout the past 12 months or more.

In contrast, exports from New Zealand and Uruguay, which both produce mainly wool broader than 25 micron, saw export volumes drop from the second half of 2015. While the export volumes remain below year earlier levels for both countries, there is a clear upward trend and recovery of recent months. The lift in exports from New Zealand is particularly sharp, pointing to an increase in demand for this broader wool.
