China's imports of raw wool lifts in September

The latest data on China's trade in raw wool and wool products shows that September saw a significant lift in imports from New Zealand, Uruguay and 'other' countries. This continued the year-on-year increase seen in August and begins to offset the large decline seen in China's imports of raw and semi-processed wool from these countries in the past 12 to 18 months. China's imports from Australia were up in September, but its imports from South Africa were well down on September 2016. The lift in China's imports from NZ and Uruguay hasn't yet offset the previous drop earlier in 2017. China's imports from 'other' countries have lifted for the year to date and is near the high seen in recent years.
